Market Profile: South Korea




Trade

 Total almond shipments to South Korea in FY 24/25 totaled 61.4 million pounds, up slightly from 59.5 million pounds in FY 2023/24, but still down almost 20% compared to the record of 76 million lbs. in FY 2020/21.



 South Korea is now the 9th largest export destination destination for U.S. almonds in FY 24/25 South Korea is now the 3rd largest export destination in Asia, behind India and Japan, and edging ahead of China.


Almond Exports to South Korea (Million Lbs.) Aug-July ABC Data in Lbs/MTs

Market Access

 A phytosanitary Certificate is required for both shelled and inshell nuts.

Key Issues

- A 0% tariff is in place as a result of the Korea-U.S. (KORUS) trade agreement.
- A positive list for pesticides went into effect in 2017; the
 majority of almond MRL's are consistent with U.S. limits and
 import tolerances are in place for critical compounds, except
 couple of key post-harvest treatment compounds. ABC is
 currently working with the registrant to try and establish
 import tolerances for these compounds.
- Korea tends to follow Japan's food safety notifications; when there were higher aflatoxin rejections in Japan, almonds were briefly added to the mandatory import surveillance list in Korea.
